Jakarta, or the Special Capital Region of Jakarta, is the capital of Indonesia. With a population of 10 million people in the city proper, and some 30 million in Jakarta and abutting cities, it is both the largest city in the country and the largest city in Southeast Asia.

Jakarta is a highly densely populated city, and the majority of the population live in Kampongs or urban villages, where simple houses abut one another in long rows, and where schools, clinics, shops, factories, streams, mosques and fields compete for precious space.

Life in the Kampongs is typically hot, humid, smoky and with gaps in municipal and other public services. Still, millions call the Kampongs their home. And they live life to the fullest in the Kampongs.
